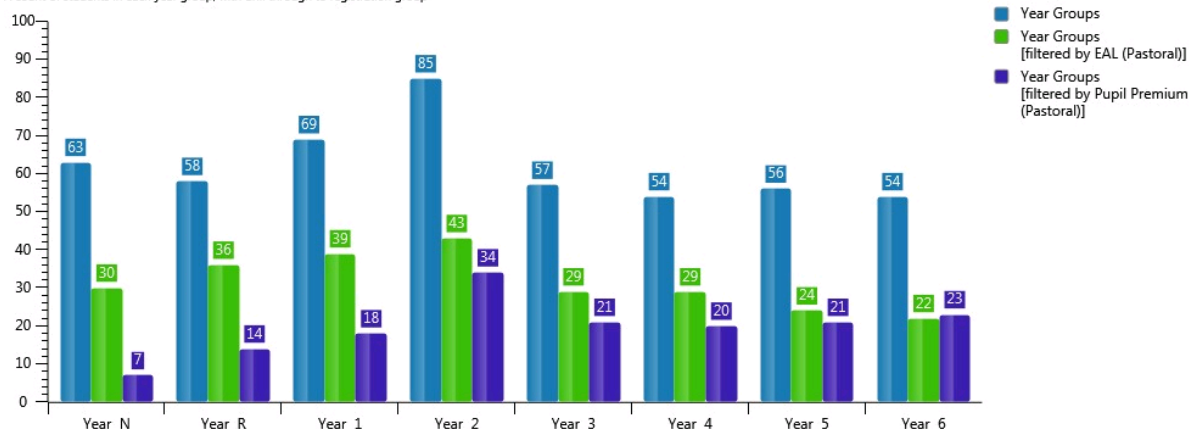


## Number of children in each year group:

Student Totals by Year Group

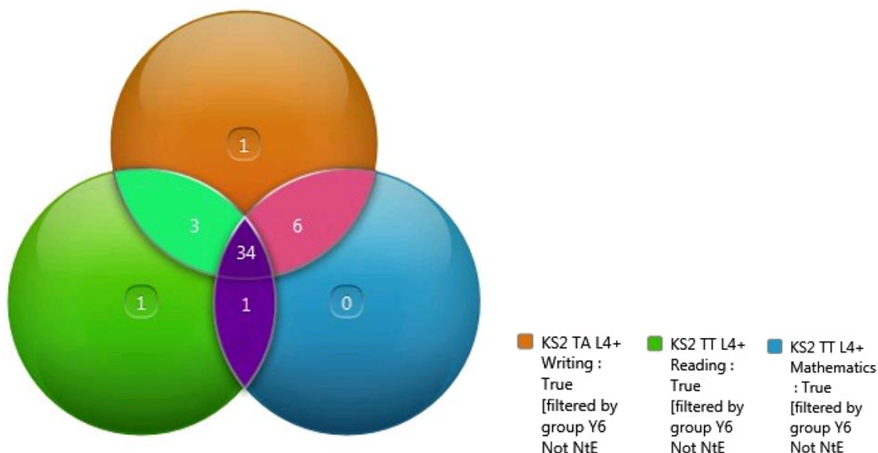
A count of students in each year group, with drill through to registration group



There is little cross over between EAL and Pupil Premium, so most children are either EAL or are in receipt of one form of Pupil Premium.

## Year 6 combined results July 2015

The Venn below shows the numbers of children attaining / not attaining each level. 34 of the 50 children achieved L4 in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. Another 10 children attained L4 in two of the three subjects. There were 6 children who had maths and writing but did not achieve reading. The test this year had a number of questions which required children to have a broad vocabulary in order to access the questions.

Last year the average attendance for the year was 93.1% an improving trend for the past three years. Currently the attendance this year is 94.6% compared to 95.5% for similar schools.
