

**The use of Pupil Premium at Orchards C of E Primary School
Autumn 2012 – Spring 2013**

Overview	<p>The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated to Local Authorities and schools with pupils from Reception to Y11 who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), are looked after or have parents currently in the Armed Forces.</p> <p>In 2011/12 the funding allocated was £488 per child, and £200 for children of Armed Forces families. This rose to £600 and £250 respectively in for this academic year.</p> <p>From April 2012 the coverage of the Premium was widened to include those eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years, so it is really important to tell us if you think your child may be eligible.</p>
