

The use of Pupil Premium 2013-14 including planned spend

<p>Overview</p>	<p>The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated to Local Authorities and schools with pupils from Reception to Y11 who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), are looked after or have parents currently in the Armed Forces.</p> <p>In 12/13 the funding allocated was £953 per child and £250 for children of Armed Forces families. This will rise to £1900 for FSM pupil, £1,00 for LAC children and £300 for service children in 2014/5. From April 2012 the coverage of the Premium was widened to include those eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years.</p>
<p>Total amount allocated to the school for the current academic year.</p>	<p>Our funding for this year is £133,420 funding for pupils who are entitled to a Free School Meal. In addition to this we receive £750 per pupil to support those who speak English as an Additional Language, with a total of £91,697.</p>
